The selection group meets in April. They look for quality of work, skill involved and originality. Applications from new exhibitors that meet these criteria are especially welcome. Two places are allocated for emerging makers and new enterprises.

In order to keep the fair fresh and exciting acceptance is reviewed on an annual basis. If you have already exhibited with us for a few years we hope that you will understand if we decline your application this year and that it will not deter you from applying again in future years.

Full size stands are 6' x 4' at £110. The team will allocate some smaller starter stands at £90.

You will be notified about your application before the end of April and if successful you will receive a booking form.

**Please do not send a cheque with your initial application.**

For those of you new to Crux:

We are a non profit making organisation run by volunteer craftspeople. All stand fees go towards running the fair.

**We ask you to make a donation of your craft work to the raffle that is run each year by a local charity (see below)**

We may also ask you to help a little towards making the fair run smoothly by taking on a small job at the weekend.

**Once you have been selected, sending in your stall fee assumes you have read and accepted the following terms and conditions:**

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

Makers are required to be on the stand themselves and sell work that they have made themselves. No bought in work or work by makers other than the selected maker will be allowed on the stand.

Makers must be prepared to set up their stalls and be in attendance for the whole period of the fair including the Friday evening opening.

All electrical appliances must have been PAT tested. Wires must not trail but be taped to the floor with duck tape.

CRUX takes out public liability insurance to cover the fair but your work is your own responsibility. **You should ensure that you have public liability to cover your own set up and stock.**

There is no shell scheme. Spaces are marked out by the CRUX team who will be on hand during the set up to ensure the allocated spaces are adhered to. Your stand must stay within the designated marked space, not encroach on your neighbours, block the aisle or cause safety issues.

**Each year Crux supports a local charity with a raffle of makers work.**

**This is a big part of our fair and the charity has it's own stand with all the raffle prized on it, the raffle is drawn towards the end of the fair. You are asked to donate a piece of your work of approx £20- £30 in value. Bought in work or gifts are not acceptable.**
